


Routine Based Intervention in the Community: Utilizing Deaf Mentors and Interpreters to support family outcomes for Deaf and Hard of Hearing bilingual children.

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## **Functional Outcomes/Goals**

### Types of outcomes:

• Outcomes can be participation-based or routine/activity-based

#### Child outcomes should:

- Enhance learning through functional participation in everyday activities (child is learner/actor)
- Be important and meaningful to the family/caregiver (priorities)
- Expand activity settings so child can be competent
- Are based on child's interests

## **Family Outcomes**



- Family outcomes can be child related or family based.
- Child-related family outcomes are those things the family wants to happen for their child's interventions
- They might be about information, obtaining equipment, looking for resources (even services), learning a skill that will help the child (e.g., sign language or cued speech), etc.
- Family-level outcomes can by focused on extended family members.

# **The Smith Family**

- Molly is a 2.8-year-old Deaf toddler
- Mom and Dad are hearing.
- The family has chosen bilingualism for Molly: ASL and Listening/Spoken Language.



## The Family's Outcomes

- At her second birthday, her IFSP highlighted specific outcomes including:
  - Reduce behaviors during storytime at the local library and at home
  - Discover ways to communicate and provide access for Molly in large family gatherings
  - Attend to a speaker when they are communicating (joint attention)
