Grant Deliverables

- 1. Develop and submit a plan to identify at least ten family mentors who represent all communication modalities statewide.
- 2. Develop education materials for families that involve family representation within the development of free toolkit materials.
- 3. Develop appropriate in-person and electronic Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities approved training opportunities that convey the attitudes and views of families with infants and toddlers who are deaf and hard of hearing to increase enrollment in early intervention.
- 4. Participate in all mandatory meetings as assigned.
- 5. Have ten family mentors available statewide for families to consult that include access to mentors representing all communication modalities at no cost to the families.
- 6. Develop appropriate in-person and electronic training opportunities that convey the attitudes and views of families with infants and toddlers who are deaf and hard of hearing to increase awareness for Central Coordination staff
- 7. Develop appropriate in-person and electronic training opportunities that convey the attitudes and views of families with infants and toddlers who are deaf and hard of hearing to increase awareness for diagnosing audiologists.
- 8. Develop appropriate in-person and electronic training opportunities that convey the attitudes and views of families with infants and toddlers who are deaf and hard of hearing to increase awareness for early intervention providers.
- 9. Financially support one family to attend the 2018 Annual EHDI Conference. The family must have a child who is currently enrolled in Ohio's Part C program, under the age of three and is deaf/hard of hearing.
- 10. Submit monthly reports on the tenth of each month.
