- Home-based office
- Role
  - Family support following diagnosis
  - Start Hands & Voices in Maine



### 2007 Law changed

- Mandated Audiology Reporting
  - Anyone performing screens or diagnostics through age 3
  - Reports submitted via web-form or manually

# When Baby Refers on Newborn Hearing Screening



By one month of age ......

#### Screening facility

- Required to schedule follow-up appointment
- Complete and fax Maine EHDI program referral form to PCP and Maine EHDI office



#### By one month of age.....

- Maine EHDI program
  - Follow-up Coordinator contacts screening facility for any missing information on Maine EHDI program referral form
  - Follow-up Coordinator contacts PCP
  - Parent Consultant contacts family



### By three months of age....

- Follow-up appointment...
  - Follow-up Coordinator
    - Contacts Audiologist if no report
    - Contacts PCP if no follow-up
  - Parent Consultant
    - Contacts family if no follow-up
    - Contacts family if hearing loss confirmed
    - Collaborates with Early Intervention



### By six months of age....

- Parent Consultant
  - Follow-up support
  - Collaborates with early intervention
- Follow-up Coordinator
  - Contacts PCP and Audiologist as needed
- Enrolled in Early Intervention
  - Part C
  - Early Childhood and Family Services (ECFS)
  - Memorandum of Agreement




#### What we have learned

- Parent Voice to Professionals
  - Screening Facility, PCP and Audiologist
- Parent Voice in EHDI awareness programs
  - Screening facilities
  - Staff programs
  - Early Intervention
  - Improved Data
