



Data Collected

- Surveys sent to
 - Local Program Administrators (n=8)
 - Service Coordinators (n=39)
 - Providers (*n*=112)
 - Families (n=2)

At this time, 1.8% of our families are receiving their services via telehealth




More Data

- Most respondents indicate that telehealth is used for:
 - inclement weather
 - illness
 - to address provider shortages
 - to reduce travel
- Respondents like the flexibility telehealth offers
- There is still an over-riding impression that telehealth is not family-friendly, it's impersonal, and it's not as good as in-person visits




Q4 Compared to children I see in person, I find that the children I see via telehealth sessions make:






Q5 Compared to families I see in person, I find that the parents/caregivers I see via telehealth sessions are:






Q6 The technology I use works:





Q12 Years of experience in early intervention






Comments from Providers

- "It engages the family even more, they have to gather materials and you give them direct instruction on how to carry out techniques"
- "I have used telehealth in the past for a few clients. Once the family and I figured out how to best use the time and how to set up their environment for success, it was very positive. This was used primarily because the families lived far away. We were able to have more sessions because the time needed for travel was eliminated. Extra sessions were helpful for the child and family. Personally, it was very helpful for me in terms of time, gas, and wear/tear on my vehicle. I felt that in at least one case, tele sessions were better organized as the parent began to plan ahead for our 'meetings' and have a list of comments/questions available for me. This did not happen with direct visits before that."


Q1 Telehealth is used with the following:
