#### Bullying

• CDC (2019) defines bullying as any <u>unwanted aggressive</u> <u>behavior(s)</u> by another youth or group of youths, who are not siblings or current dating partners that <u>involves an observed or perceived power imbalance</u> and is repeated multiple times or is highly likely to be repeated.



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# Types of bullying

#### Common types of bullying:

#### **Physical**

hitting, kicking, punching, spitting, tripping, pushing

#### **Emotional**

teasing, name calling, inappropriate sexual comments, or verbal or written threats



#### Social

excluding someone, spreading rumors, making embarrassing comments





### Signs of bullying

- Unexplainable injuries
- Lost or destroyed clothing, books, electronics, or jewelry
- Frequent headaches or stomach aches, feeling sick or faking illness
- Changes in eating habits, like suddenly skipping meals or binge eating. Kids may come home from school hungry because they did not eat lunch.
- Difficulty sleeping or frequent nightmares
- Declining grades, loss of interest in schoolwork, or not wanting to go to school
- Sudden loss of friends or avoidance of social situations
- Feelings of helplessness or decreased self esteem
- Self-destructive behaviors such as running away from home, harming themselves, or talking about suicide













How easy were these questions to answer?

After answering the survey questions, do you think it would be easier to talk about your feelings?






#### How did those questions make you feel?
