- Cerebral palsy/probable
 CMV 6 mos.
- Profound deafness 8 mos.
 - ADHD Kindergarten
 - Raynaud's 9th grade
 - Anxiety College
 - Seizures, Epilepsy, Osteoporosis... - College

Adjustment

- Lots of professionals
- So many appointments
 - Many decisions
- Language/ communication learning
 - Role models sought
 - Change in homes
 - New career
 - Loads of money spent

Challenges & JOYS

- Conflicting messages
 - Trust in ourselves
- Our son delights us
- Search for resources

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
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

Strategies for Supporting DHH Plus Children

Adapting Communication

Blending methodologies & technologies for communication is more common. Affirm the child's communication attempts. Flexibility will often be needed.

Allowing Time

Showing patience and creating calming spaces to interact is often necessary. Motor challenges contribute to fatigue and reduced selfregulation for a child. Processing or learning challenges require additional time.

Foster learning, adults & other children

Natural Interactions

Important for understanding social & behavioral norms Multiple Opportunities

Many chances to develop knowledge & skills – with support, then independently

Social & Cultural Influences

Learning in Context

Child in Context

Children learn and grow within their cultural system and social experiences

Children learn through events, activities in contexts that are needed to build background knowledge Consider the child's surroundings (people, settings, etc.) as a way to build their skills
