
As Telemedicine became more organized...



 There were conferences and meetings where programs shared what they were learning and developing. Not surprisingly many programs were developing the same policies, resources and tools.








- Established in 1993

- Selected in 2006 by HRSA as the National Telehealth Resource Center

- Offers a yearly Telehealth Leadership Conference a national public policy conference dedicated solely to telehealth issues
- Presents monthly brown-bag webinars on public policy issues
- Publishes, Inside Washington & Beyond, an e-newsletter keeping the telehealth community apprised of important public policy information and developments.





- In 2006 the federal Office for the Advancement of Telehealth (OAT) initiated a regional telehealth resource center grant program to provide support and guidance to telehealth programs.
- There are five resource centers (TRCs) one national and 4 regional.
- They can provide services, resources and tools to both developing and operating programs.
- Each TRC also has an understanding of regional concerns and the climate for telehealth in their geographic region.
