

Call for Student Posters at 2020 National EHDI Meeting



19TH ANNUAL EARLY HEARING DETECTION & INTERVENTION MEETING
MARCH 8-10, 2020 • KANSAS CITY, MO

We are contacting you because you might know of students who would be interested in submitting a poster and attending the 2020 National EHDI Meeting that will take place March 8-10 in Kansas City, Missouri, Illinois. We are expecting more than 1,200 participants, representing the many different stakeholders in the EHDI community.

Students are invited to submit a proposal for a student poster that will be included in the general poster session held on Monday, March 9th from 12:30 PM to 1:45 PM. To submit a poster, students should go to

and complete the form. Note that this link for student posters is not visible on the EHDI Meeting website, so please make a note of it.

Submissions for the student posters MUST be received by **December 14, 2019**. This is a great opportunity for students to present their research and/or leadership projects. We only have room for 30 student posters in addition to approximately 60 posters that have been accepted for the Meeting, so students should submit their abstracts for a poster presentation as soon as possible. The abstract is limited to 300 words, so it is very doable. **(Note: If students have a poster accepted as a part of the regular “call for abstracts” they do not have to submit that proposal again).**

Notification of whether posters in the general session were accepted will be sent by **December 2, 2019** and notification about acceptance of student posters in response to this call will be sent by **January 8, 2020**.

Because the organizers of the National EHDI Meeting are interested in preparing future leaders who have the knowledge, skills, and experience to continue to expand and improve EHDI systems, the registration cost for students to attend the meeting is only \$175 instead of the regular rate of \$400. Registration is now open at <https://ehdimeeting.org/Reg.cfm>.

At the onsite registration desk students will be given a colored ribbon to attach to his or her name tag. This will enable students to more easily identify each other during the meeting for networking and support. A committee of students is working to create various “networking opportunities.” More information will be distributed to anyone registered as a student as the time for the National EHDI Meeting approaches.
